**Supporting the Click It or Ticket Mobilization of
May 19 – June 1, 2014.**

- **WHEREAS**, there were 545 motor vehicle fatalities in New Jersey in 2013;
- **WHEREAS**, a large percentage of the motor vehicle occupants killed in traffic crashes were not wearing a seat belt;
- **WHEREAS**, use of a seatbelt remains the most effective way to avoid death or serious injury in a motor vehicle crash;
- **WHEREAS**, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration estimates that 135,000 lives were saved by safety belt usage nationally between 1975-2000;
- **WHEREAS**, the State of New Jersey will participate in the nationwide Click It or Ticket seat belt mobilization from May 19 – June 1, 2014 in an effort to raise awareness and increase seat belt usage through a combination of enforcement and education;
- **WHEREAS**, the Division of Highway Traffic Safety has set a goal of increasing the seat belt usage rate in the state from the current level of 91% to 92%;
- **WHEREAS**, a further increase in seat belt usage in New Jersey will save lives on our roadways;
- **THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Borough of Hillsdale, declares it's support for the Click It or Ticket seat belt mobilization both locally and nationally from May 19 – June 1, 2014 and pledges to increase awareness of the mobilization and the benefits of seat belt use.

PROCLAMATION

**NATIONAL PRIMARY IMMUNO DEFICIENCIES
DISEASES AWARENESS**

Designating April 1014 as National Primary Immuno Deficiencies Diseases Awareness Month and supporting efforts to increase awareness of Primary Immuno Deficiencies. Diseases and increase funding for Primary Immuno Deficiencies disease research.

- WHEREAS, Primary Immuno Deficiencies Diseases are chronic, disabling Diseases in which underlying genetic defects in the immune system lead the body to more complicated and frequent infections;
- WHEREAS, Primary Immuno Deficiencies Diseases can affect any part of the body, including the brood, blood *vessels*, muscles, nervous system, gastrointestinal tract, endocrine glands, and multiple-organ systems, and can be life-threatening;
- WHEREAS, researchers have identified over zoo different Primary Immuno Deficiencies *Diseases*;
- WHEREAS, the family of Primary Immuno Deficiencies Diseases is under-recognized, and poses a major health care challenge to the United States;
- WHEREAS, Primary Immuno Deficiencies Diseases most often affect children and adults, leading to a lifetime of disability;
- WHEREAS, diagnostic tests for most Primary Immuno Deficiencies Diseases are not standardized, making Primary Immuno Deficiencies Diseases very difficult to diagnose;
- WHEREAS, because Primary Immuno Deficiencies Diseases are difficult to diagnose, treatment is often delayed, resulting in irreparable organ damage and unnecessary suffering;

- WHEREAS, a study by the Immune Deficiency Foundation (IDF) revealed that it takes the average patient with an Primary Immuno Deficiencies disease between 9 to 12 years to be diagnosed correctly;
- WHEREAS, there is a significant need for more collaboration and cross-fertilization of basic Primary Immuno Deficiencies research;
- WHEREAS, the IDF is a coalition focused on Primary Immuno Deficiencies Diseases working to consolidate the voices of patients with Primary Immuno Deficiencies Diseases and to promote increased education, awareness, and research into all aspects of. Primary Immuno Deficiencies Diseases through a collaborative approach; and
- WHEREAS, designating April 2014 as National Primary Immuno Deficiencies Diseases Awareness Month would help educate the public about Primary Immuno Deficiencies Diseases and the need for research funding, accurate diagnosis, and effective treatments.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that 1, Max Arnowitz, Mayor of the Borough of Hillsdale, ask that all residents of this community join me in supporting the Awareness of Primary Immuno Deficiencies Diseases

[#] NJDOT confirmed the award of \$250,000 in funding on March 21, 2014 per our conversation with Richard Loveless, NJDOT Local Aid Office.

The NJDOT Discretionary Aid applications for Kent Road and Baylor Avenue improvements were awarded \$250,000 in funding by the NJDOT and a notice of award letter was received by the Borough for use.

The Bergen County Open Space Trust Fund application is currently under final review of the Bergen County Freeholders. As discussed with Mr. Robert Abattomarco, Bergen County Division of Open Space, it is anticipated that grant award announcements will be made at the May 06, 2014 freeholders meeting.

3. SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROGRAM (YEAR 2014)

Per the request of the Borough, Neglia Engineering Associates has moved forward with the SRTS application process for the improvements to Piermont Avenue between Magnolia Avenue and Everdell Avenue, to Hillsdale Avenue from Everdell Avenue to Cedar Lane, and to the intersections of Piermont Avenue and Kinderkamack Road and Piermont Avenue and Ruckman Road. Improvements on said streets will include ADA ramp and route improvements, concrete sidewalk, concrete curbing, driveway aprons, utility relocations and improvements, resetting of manholes, landscape retaining walls, landscaping, tree removal, sign relocation, etc. We have been continuously working with the Borough, Police Department and the Board of Education to obtain required and additional documentation to include in the application and support the Borough's request for funding the project.

Please note that the NJDOT has recently posted on their website that the deadline for this grant application was extended to Monday, June 30, 2014.

4. TRAIN STATION IMPROVEMENT FUNDING

Per the request of the Borough, Neglia Engineering Associates has researched funding / grant application programs available to the Borough for the improvement(s) of the New Jersey Transit (NJT) Train Station. As discussed with the NJDOT, the Borough is in the process of obtaining an authorization letter from New Jersey Transit to allow access to the site for rehabilitation purposes and to submit a Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) application for such improvements on their behalf as the train station is not located on municipal property.



Individuals from this office visited the site on April 17, 2014 to observe the physical conditions of the train station, both exterior and partial interior areas, and have since provided a list of items to the Borough that could be considered for possible improvements.

Please note that the NJDOT has recently posted on their website that the deadline for this grant was extended to Monday, June 30, 2014 and also stated that "is it recommended that projects have a requested funding amount of at least \$150,000 and a soft cap of \$1 million."

As requested by the NJDOT, the Borough submitted a letter to NJT requesting authorization to access the site for the planned improvements. This office has followed up with the NJT and they assured us that we will be receiving a response by May 5, 2014 to include in the application.

5. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT STATUS (YEAR 2012)

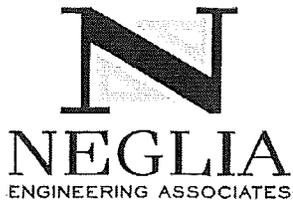
Per the request of the Borough, Neglia Engineering Associates has reviewed the awarded 2012 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) applications for (1) a new accessible pool lift at Stonybrook Swim Club, and (2) retrofitting the bathrooms within Borough Hall to comply with accessible standards. The 2012 CDBG applications are discussed in further detail below:

Accessible Pool Lift at Stonybrook Swim Club

- \$26,000 awarded for reimbursement
- Grant expires on June 30, 2014*
 - * As discussed with Michele Popkin, executive assistant with the Bergen County Division of Community Development, if the Borough shows progress towards completion of this project by means of releasing solicitation documents, holding a pre-construction meeting, and commencing construction prior to the June 30th deadline, Bergen County will honor the full reimbursement if construction is completed by the end of August-2014.
- A pre-construction meeting was held on Thursday, April 17, 2014. The Contractor will commence construction the first week of May-2014 and complete construction by May 19, 2014.

Retrofitting Bathrooms at Borough Hall to comply with Accessible Standards

- \$65,000 awarded for reimbursement
- Grant expires on June 30, 2014*
 - * As discussed with Michele Popkin, executive assistant with the Bergen County Division of Community Development, if the Borough shows progress towards completion of this project by means of releasing out-to-bid documents, holding a pre-construction meeting, and commencing construction prior to the June 30th deadline, Bergen County will honor the full reimbursement if construction is completed by the end of August-2014.
- Since meeting with the County at the site on Thursday, April 17, 2014, the County stated that the authorized funding cannot be used for the project as described in the grant application as there is already an ADA restroom on the same floor of the requested



improvements. In discussing other potential accessible improvements to borough hall with the County while on-site, it was agreed by the County and the Borough to move forward with installing automatic ADA door operators at the double rear entry doors and single ADA restroom door locations at Borough Hall and the main double entry doors to the police department. The Borough has since received authorization from Bergen County to move forward with this project.

- This office has solicited this project to five (5) contractors on April 30, 2014 for quotes to be received by May 7, 2014 at 10:00 AM.

6. POLICE DEPARTMENT GRANTS / FUNDING (YEAR 2014)

Per the request of the Borough, Neglia Engineering Associates has researched funding / grant application programs available to the Borough and Borough's Police Department based on conversations had with Sergeant McLaughlin. The Borough is interested in revitalizing downtown to help improve pedestrian and vehicular traffic in the area by decreasing the number of vehicle-to-pedestrian and vehicle-to-vehicle incidents. The list of funds / grants below, as well as required application documents and supporting incident information, will be acquired from Sergeant McLaughlin to submit complete applications to the County and State for review in-line with the presented application deadlines as discussed with the reviewing authority.

Two (2) enforcement campaign applications have already been submitted by Sgt. McLaughlin of the Hillsdale Police Department that consist of requests for reimbursement of the Click-it-or-Ticket grant and the Distracted Driver grant, both Comprehensive Traffic Safety Program reimbursement opportunities.

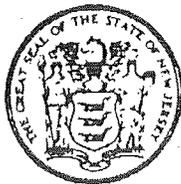

**BOROUGH OF HILLSDALE
ORDINANCE NO. 14-08**

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FUNDING FOR UPGRADES TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT COMPUTER FOR THE BOROUGH OF HILLSDALE AND APPROPRIATING \$72,500 FOR SUCH PURPOSE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF HILLSDALE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Borough of Hillsdale, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the “Borough”), authorizes improvements to the Police Department Computer System including the RMS/CAD/E-Ticket/Evidence and associated hardware and all work or materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto for the Borough to be funded from the sources specified in Section 2 of the Ordinance.

Section 2. The amount of \$72,500 is hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in Section 1 of the Ordinance (of which \$70,000 is for construction and \$2,500 is for the remaining costs) and which amount being funded through both Capital and Current Fund budgets included in the Borough of Hillsdale’s 2014 Adopted Municipal Budget.

Section 3. In connection with the purpose and the amount authorized in Sections 1 and 2 hereof, the Borough determines the purposes described in Section 1 hereof is not a Current Expense and is an improvement which the Borough may lawfully make as a general improvement.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon due passage and publication according to law.

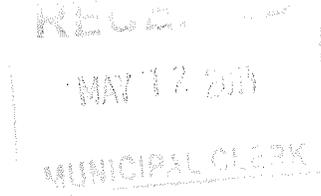

ORDINANCE NO. 14-09**

**ORDINANCE BANNING HYDRAULIC FRACTURING
IN HILLSDALE, NEW JERSEY**

WHEREAS, the hydraulic fracturing (fracking) for natural gas involves the use of chemicals and hazardous materials during construction, drilling, hydraulic fracturing, gas production and delivery, well maintenance, and workover operations; and

WHEREAS, hydraulic fracturing of underground geologic formations is often accomplished by injecting a complex mix of fluids and chemicals, including large volumes of water, on average 4.5 million gallons per well, under very high pressure to create fractures in gas bearing geologic formations; and

WHEREAS, the US Geological Survey has identified what could be up to 1.6 trillion cubic feet of gas in New Jersey in the South Newark Basin and has yet to assess the North Newark Basin, which likely has trillions of cubic feet of gas as well.

WHEREAS, many of the chemical constituents injected during hydraulic fracturing have documented adverse health effects and/or adverse environmental impacts; and

WHEREAS, there have been more than 1,000 documented cases of water contamination near fracking sites; some people who live near these sites can now light their drinking water on fire; and

WHEREAS, wastewater from fracking may contain radioactive elements and other toxic components and has been discharged into rivers that supply drinking water for millions; and

WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's Department of Environmental Protection has documented three facilities in NJ as accepting waste from hydraulic fracturing operations, posing a direct threat to NJ's drinking water.

WHEREAS, use of these hydraulic fracturing mixes exposed air, aquifers and adjacent land and surface waters to the risk of contamination through spills and accidents, open pit storage, truck transport on roadways, and activities during well development; and

WHEREAS, Former President George W. Bush's EPA point person on water now admits fracking should never have been exempted from regulation; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey's Legislature and Governor have enacted a one-year moratorium on fracking that expired in January of 2013; and

WHEREAS, since the New Jersey Legislature originally acted to ban fracking, the case for a ban on fracking is strengthened by a US EPA report of contaminants associated with fracking being found in an aquifer in Pavilion Wyoming, and separate incidents involving earthquakes in Ohio linked to fracking waste disposal using injection wells; and

WHEREAS, wastewater, wastewater solids or sludge, drill cuttings and/or other byproducts from the fracking process are known to contain toxic levels of contaminants, including unknown quantities of undisclosed chemical additives used in hydraulic fracturing fluid, as well as contaminants from sources

underground; Benzene, naphthalene, formaldehyde, cadmium, mercury, arsenic, total dissolved solids, and radioactive material, such as radium, are among the known contaminants; and

WHEREAS, methods of treatment and disposal for fracking waste do not eliminate the risks that hydraulic fracturing wastewater, wastewater solids or sludge, drill cuttings and/or other byproducts pose to human health and the environment; and

WHEREAS, A575/S253 passed the NJ Legislature in June 2012 with strong bipartisan support, and would prohibit treatment, discharge, disposal, or storage of waste from hydraulic fracturing in New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, Governor Christie vetoed A575/S253 in September 2012; and

WHEREAS, fracking is exempt from important regulations meant to protect public health and the environment, specifically sections of the Clean Water Act, Clean Air Act, Safe Drinking Water Act, Superfund, National Environmental Policy Act, Resource Conservation and Recovery Act; and

WHEREAS, at least five pipeline expansion projects, which will transport fracked gas, are planned for NJ, passing through densely populated communities like Jersey City and environmentally sensitive areas in the NJ Highlands and Pinelands, encompassing protected land paid for and owned by the people of New Jersey to be preserved as open space to protect water resources; and

WHEREAS, historically 100% of US produced gas has been used domestically, and now 12% of US produced gas is being exported to international markets via liquefied natural gas (LNG) terminals, and 25% of gas production has been approved for export through these terminals; and

WHEREAS, previous decisions to halt the construction of LNG facilities in New Jersey and off our coast could be reversed to profit gas companies who can charge six to eight times as much for gas in Europe and Asia, respectively, as they can in the US; and

WHEREAS, under existing State law regulating drilling for oil and natural gas under N.J.S.A.13:1M-18 and N.J.S.A.13:1M-1 et seq., a local governing body may ban drilling for natural gas, and exploration for natural gas beyond the "reconnaissance" phase.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, that on the 10th day of June 2014, that drilling for natural gas, using the drilling technique of hydraulic fracturing and exploring for natural gas beyond the reconnaissance phase is prohibited within Hillsdale, New Jersey.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, said copy of adopted ordinance be sent to District 39 State Legislators; District 5 Congressional; Chairman of Bergen County Freeholders; Governor Christie; Senator Menendez; New Jersey Sierra Club; Delaware Riverkeeper Network; and Food and Water Watch.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, this Ordinance shall be effective upon final passage and publication as required by law.

WHEREAS, under the Palisades Interstate Park Commission’s Congressionally approved 1937 Interstate Compact, it was agreed to and pledged the “faithful co-operation in the future planning, improvement, development, maintenance, government and management of the park, holding in high trust for the benefit of the public the special blessings and natural advantages thereof”; and

WHEREAS, with a fourfold increase upon existing zoning, the 143-foot height of the proposed development of the LG USA Headquarters in Englewood Cliffs, New Jersey, poses a new threat and precedent to the scenic beauty of the Palisades north of the George Washington Bridge; and

WHEREAS, the development needs of an LG USA headquarters on this 27-acre site can be achieved at a lower building height that would not pose such a threat and precedent to the scenic beauty of the Palisades; and

WHEREAS, the Commission, through the Executive Director, provided correspondence and testimony to the Englewood Cliffs Zoning Board expressing concerns about the adverse visual impact on the Park and its historic and scenic integrity as a national landmark by the proposed height of the building and sent a letter dated November 14, 2012 to Seog-Won Park, Chief Executive Officer of LG Electronics USA, Inc., expressing similar concerns; and

WHEREAS, letters from the National Park Service dated December 23, 2013 from William Bolger, National Historic Landmark Manager and January 7, 2014 from Kristina Heister, Chief of Natural Resources for the Northeast Region both detail the significance of the area and how the construction of a 143-foot building would threaten the integrity of this nationally designated area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Palisades Interstate Park Commission finds that the height of the proposed LG USA Headquarters building above the tree line is not in accordance with our stewardship mission and the public trust to preserve the scenic beauty of the Palisades and would create a precedent inconsistent with our mission and again urge the management of LG USA, Inc. to lower the proposed height of the building to below the tree line in order to preserve the scenic beauty of the Palisades; and

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR THE
PROVISION OF 911 EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, commencing on this ____ day of January 2014, by and between:

BOROUGH OF PARAMUS (hereinafter referred to as "PARAMUS"), being a Municipal Corporation of the State of New Jersey, with offices at One Jockish Square, Paramus, New Jersey 07652 and;

BOROUGH OF HILLSDALE, (hereinafter referred to as "HILLSDALE"), a Municipal Corporation of the State of New Jersey with offices at 380 Hillsdale Avenue, Hillsdale, New Jersey, 07642.

WHEREAS, each of the above parties has adopted a Resolution pursuant to the provisions of the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq., and;

WHEREAS, HILLSDALE seeks to utilize the services of PARAMUS to provide Public Safety Answering Point ("PSAP") emergency 911 telephone service;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. PARAMUS agrees to provide emergency 911 telephone service for HILLSDALE for the 2014 calendar year. Said service shall consist of a PSAP which utilizes enhanced network features, which shall include, but not be limited to the following:

- A. All PSAP services as defined in New Jersey law;
- B. Translation of 911 calls from non-English speaking persons; and
- C. Reverse 911 services based on maps and dates provided by HILLSDALE in a format compatible with PARAMUS' current technology.

Said PSAP shall be designed, constructed, modified, operated and maintained in such a manner so as to be at all times during the period covered by this Agreement in full compliance with all applicable statutory standards and amendments, regulations or rules adopted pursuant thereto.

2. The parties hereto specifically acknowledge and agree that the provision of PSAP services by PARAMUS does not mean and shall not be interpreted to mean that PARAMUS will undertake the dispatching function of HILLSDALE. HILLSDALE shall be responsible to continue to provide their own public safety dispatch point.

3. HILLSDALE understands and agrees that PARAMUS is relying upon the payments due under this agreement for the duration of the terms of the Agreement. HILLSDALE agrees that it may not withdraw during the term of this Agreement without the express consent of PARAMUS.

4. HILLSDALE will pay PARAMUS fees for said service based upon the population of HILLSDALE at the rate of fifty cents (\$0.50) per qualified municipal resident, plus the applicable percentage for Language Line Services, for a total of Five Thousand Two Hundred and Thirty Seven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$5,237.50) per year. The determination of the number of residents shall be in accordance with the most recent census figures.

5. In the event of any dispute between the parties hereto, the full amount claimed by PARAMUS shall be paid by HILLSDALE. If through subsequent negotiation, arbitration or litigation, the amount shall be determined to be less than the amount actually paid, PARAMUS shall immediately return the excess money.

6. Except as provided below in this paragraph 6, the parties agree to resolve any dispute arising out of or relating to this agreement pursuant to the New Jersey Alternative Procedure for Dispute Resolution Act, N.J.S.A. 2A:23A-1 et seq. The cost of the Neutral shall

be borne by the parties in equal shares; provided that if the Neutral finds that a party's position was "frivolous" (as defined in N.J.S.A. 2A:15-59.1), then the Neutral may reallocate the cost of the Neutral in an equitable manner. The dispute resolution procedure provided for in this Section 10 shall not apply to a dispute between the parties based upon a cause of action against which insurance has been procured by the allegedly liable party.

7. Each party shall name the other as an additional insured on any insurance policy maintained by each party against public liability and property damage arising out of the PSAP services and shall cause each insurance policy obtained by it to provide that the insurance carrier waives all right of recovery by way of subrogation against the other party in connection with any damage covered by any policy.

8. Each party retains all immunities and defenses from liability granted by law including, but not limited to, those provided by the Tort Claims Act (N.J.S.A. 59:1-1 et seq. and those in N.J.S.A. 52:17C-10.b).

9. Except as otherwise required by law, PARAMUS shall not disclose to any third party the names, addresses, phone numbers or other personal or confidential information of HILLSDALE residents or businesses acquired or maintained by PARAMUS in the course of performance of this agreement.

10. This Agreement shall continue in full force and effect for the 2014 calendar year.

11. Each party agrees to comply with such statutes, rules, laws and regulations as may be applicable during the term of this Agreement.

12. This Agreement will become effective upon the execution of this Agreement and the adoption of Resolutions under the Interlocal Services Act.

13. This Agreement may be executed in counterpart, the integration of all signature pages constituting the final Agreement hereto.
