



### 2016 TRANSIT PARKING PERMITS

2016 Parking Permits for residents and non-residents are available online only. Visit our website at [www.hillsdalenj.org](http://www.hillsdalenj.org) or [www.hillsdalepolice.com](http://www.hillsdalepolice.com) for more information and instructions on how to purchase parking permits.

Information on overnight parking in the west lot: The commuter sticker for the west lot entitles the vehicle to parking Monday through Friday, 5 a.m. to 2 p.m. (the following day). Technically there is no overnight parking in Hillsdale 2a.m.-5a.m. If someone needs permission for the lot overnight, it is the same procedure as if they need street parking permission. Call the HPD at 201-664-4200 prior to parking and request permission. Permission can be granted for 1-3 nights on a case-by-case basis. No permission will be granted during inclement weather. Weekends residents can park in the lot with or without the sticker. The same overnight rules apply.

### GARAGE SALES

You must apply for a permit if you are having a garage sale at least one week prior to

your sale. You are allowed two garage sales per year. The cost for a garage sale is \$10 per sale. Forms can be found on our website and must be brought in to Borough Hall to receive your permit card.

# MAYOR'S MESSAGE MAY

Spring has arrived and we are all moving back to outside activities after a pretty mild winter. It is time to think about summer activities and your first thought should be to consider joining our Stonybrook Swim Club. It is the best-in-class facility in the area and new, lower rates make it more affordable.

Also, with the warmer weather and more people outside enjoying our parks and commercial district, we ask everyone to slow down, stop at crosswalks and absolutely do not talk or text on cell phones. There will be a statewide crackdown on distracted driving. The "Udrive, Utext, Upay" program during April will help drivers be aware of the laws against distracted driving. Please be responsible.

We are very happy to have Jonathan DeJoseph rejoin Hillsdale as our borough administrator, chief financial officer and qualified purchasing agent. We have consolidated three positions into one, which provides for faster support and cost savings for the borough. Jon's previous experience as a borough councilman, borough administrator in Hillsdale and in another town, and as CFO for a large Bergen County department, will help Hillsdale tremendously.

We adopted our 2016 budget in April and we are proceeding to upgrade our infrastructure in accordance with plans from the 2015 and 2016 budgets. We have targeted roads for resurfacing and adding new equipment for our DPW and public safety departments. These improvements will benefit everyone in Hillsdale. Each year we

re-evaluate our infrastructure and identify areas that will need investment in the current year and out for five years. We have just completed an engineering evaluation of our roads, which will be the basis for our road resurfacing programs for the next several years. We modified the 2015 road program to recognize roads already done by PSE&G and have gotten a grant to repave Hillsdale Avenue east of Kinderkamack. Work should start this spring

We kept the municipal portion of your taxes to a 1.24 percent increase. This equates to a \$24 increase in our municipal tax for the average home valued at \$464,000. The balance of your tax bill covers our school systems and our county government. We do have some local issues in town that may strain the budget and we are working to control them. We have started our efforts to redevelop our

"Industrial Area" located off Patterson Street. This will take several years to accomplish. We are opposing the renewal of the state DEP permit for Waste Management to maintain their transfer station. Having them leave the borough would be a boost to our efforts to get this area upgraded.

I hope you all have a great spring and summer. Please be sure to enjoy Hillsdale's many parks and facilities. Take a break and sit and enjoy Sapienza Gardens, or take a nature walk in Beechwood Park. Have lunch at one of the tables in Veteran's Park. Or enjoy watching baseball, softball or soccer at one of our many ball fields in town. Our town does have a lot to offer.

## HILLSDALE POLICE DEPARTMENT

Since my last quarterly message, I am happy and excited to report that the Pedestrian Crossing signs were installed at the intersection of Broadway and Park Avenue. This sign was installed to assist pedestrians cross safely at this intersection. There are four buttons stationed at each corner. This was designed so that pedestrians can push a button which will activate yellow lighting around the sign alerting motorists that a pedestrian is attempting to cross. I urge pedestrians not to cross mid-block rather to walk to the nearest corner to cross safely at the designated cross walk. I want to thank the late Michael Babba for funding this project, as well as the Hillsdale Department of Public Works for the installation of the pedestrian crossing signs.

Motorists remember that you must STOP for pedestrians in a cross walk and pedestrians are expected to use the cross walks and not jay walk, this is for your own safety.

As summer approaches please remember to drive safe and have a designated driver when attending barbecues or summer events. This summer the Hillsdale Police Department, along with the Division of Highway Traffic Safety, will conduct a campaign called "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over," which will put additional officers on the road enforcing this initiative. The penalties for driving under the influence can cost you a loss of your driving privileges, thousands of dollars in penalties, as well as increased insurance premiums. Please be smart and designate a sober driver or contact Uber or taxi.

On Tuesday, August 2, the Hillsdale Police Department will host our second National Night Out. Please come out and meet the members of the Hillsdale Police Department, who serve you on a daily basis. This event is a great way to not only meet the Hillsdale officers who serve you but to collaborate on ideas on how to make our community safer. Last year was huge success and we want to make this year's even better, so please come out.

### *From the North (via Route 17)*

Turn right off Route 17 South onto Ridgewood Avenue (West) to Paramus Road. Turn left onto Paramus Road and continue approximately two miles to college; proceed around jug handle to main entrance.

### *From the East*

Take Route 4 West to Paramus Road (Paramus Road is  $\frac{3}{4}$  miles past Route 17 intersection.) Turn right onto Paramus Road and proceed north approximately two miles to Bergen Community College entrance on right.

### *From the South (via Route 17)*

Take Route 17 North to Century Road exit, second exit to the right, proceed around cloverleaf over Route 17 onto Century Road (West). Continue to Paramus Road and turn right onto Paramus Road to college entrance on right.

### *From the West*

Take Route 4 East to Paramus Road (exit under overpass). Turn right onto Paramus Road and proceed north for approximately two miles to college entrance on right.
