169-18C – Lou's & Dunkin' Donuts: Caller states there are rats in the alley between Lou's and Dunkin Donuts, as well as her yard. Site visit of area performed. Complaint of rodents and

burrows not verified. Inspector did observe an open dumpster lid at Dunkin Donuts. Informed the Person-In-Charge of the Dunkin Donuts to close their dumpster lids. No further action required.

187-18C – Demarest Farm: Caller claimed that her son became ill after eating a hot dog. On site, reviewed cooking procedures and hot holding of hot dogs with the person in charge. From this information, it does not appear that there is any time/temperature abuse of the food. No further action is required.

Follow up from previous complaints

122-18C and 135-18C – Waste Management: Complainant and neighbors on Piermont Avenue smell garbage from the Waste Management transfer station. Inspector went to Waste Management (sign posted informing no entrance to the property without proper P.P.E). Inspector made an appointment and met with Joe, Waste Management Site Manager. Manager informed inspector that garbage is kept inside the giant garage/building. Deodorizers were observed on the side of the garage as well as air filters going from the garage to the outside. Waste Management was to have the garbage picked up in 1 to 2 hours. Further investigation will be done. Inspector met with the complainant she stated that every so often she detects a "whiff" of odor (garbage), especially in the morning. Additional site visits were conducted. Inspector observed garbage being processed at the transfer station and detected an intermittent distinctive garbage odor. Site Manager contacted to schedule another appointment to see if there is any way to mitigate the odor when processing the wastes. Inspector met with Joe, the Site Manager. He claims there is nothing he can do to eliminate the garbage odor when transferring the wastes. Health Officer and Health Inspector both feel that this complaint should be referred to the Bergen County Health Department, which enforces air pollution regulations for Bergen county. **September Update:** Complaint was referred to Ms. Maureen Rykowski-Kelly, Bergen County CEHA. Upon following up with Ms. Rykowski-Kelly, inspector was informed that there are no violations at this time. She advised there has to be an intensity of a strong odor in order to be a violation.

131-18C – Central Avenue: Resident found a large dead rat in his shed and is concerned that the property on Central Avenue is not being maintained and is the cause of the rats. Inspector conducted a site visit to a neighboring Central Avenue property. Observed a wood pile but no rodent burrows. Inspector left his card with other Central Avenue properties to conduct additional rodent surveys. Observed construction being done near Central Ave.

September Update: Inspector met with the complainant and surveyed another property on Central Avenue. Observed some high weeds, uncovered garbage in the back of the house, and stagnant water. Owner was advised to abate concerns found on the property. After two follow-up visits to this resident, all violations were abated within a week.

165-18C – La Morenita Deli & Grocery: Complainant claims there are roaches, no visible license posted and cooking food despite being a grocery store. At the establishment, the inspector was given the extermination report. No roaches observed. Last extermination done on 8-29-18. He also observed that both the Borough Health Department License and Satisfactory placard were visible. Cooking is being done in the back of the establishment utilizing the appropriate equipment set up. A check to verify another extermination will be done.

September Update: The person-in-charge provided a receipt for the follow up extermination conducted on 9-11-18. No further action is required.
