

**Regarding:** NJ Stormwater Management Training

The Borough's Tier A - Municipal Stormwater General Permit from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) requires annual Local Public Education activities with assigned point values. The Borough is required to conduct activities totaling a minimum of **10 points** each year under their General Permit.

So to satisfy these, in 2016 the Borough conducted or will conduct the following activities:

- Maintain a display at the municipal building (**2 points**).
- Included a letter from the Mayor highlighting the requirements and environmental benefits of the various stormwater management ordinances in a Borough mailing (**5 points**).
- Made available the NJDEP Stormwater Brochure on the Borough website (**1 point**).

As your Stormwater Program Coordinator, we would like to make our annual presentation to the governing body to familiarize elected officials on stormwater management rules, our Tier A permit, and steps the Borough has already taken to minimize stormwater pollution. This training of elected officials provides an additional **3 points** toward our local public education requirements. The presentation will only require a few minutes.



**STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PRESENTATION  
To the Mayor and Council of the  
Borough of Hillsdale**

I. Conveyance of pollutants via stormwater

Water from rain and melting snow that flows over lawns, parking lots and streets is known as stormwater. This water, all called runoff, travels along gutters, into catch basins and through storm drain pipes and ditches, and eventually enters our streams and rivers untreated. Along the way, the runoff picks up waste (fast-food wrappers, cigarette butts, Styrofoam cups, etc.) and toxins (motor oil, antifreeze, fertilizers, pesticides, pet droppings, etc.).



The transport of these pollutants into local water bodies results in the destruction of fish, wildlife, and habitats; threats to public health due to contaminated food and drinking water supplies; and losses of recreational and aesthetic values.

II. Stormwater Management Rules

In 2004 New Jersey adopted Stormwater Management Rules to emphasize low impact building techniques for new developments using techniques to minimize land disturbances, minimize impervious cover, provide infiltration basins and vegetative filters. The Rules established required components of our municipal stormwater management plans. These plans require such items as groundwater recharge, runoff quantity controls, runoff quality controls, and Category One stream buffers.

Hillsdale adopted their Stormwater Management Plan and ordinances for new land use developments in 2006.

### III. Pollutant Discharge Elimination System - Stormwater Regulation Program Rules

In addition to the Stormwater Management Rules, the Pollutant Discharge Elimination System - Stormwater Regulation Program Rules were also adopted. These rules pertain to the issuance of permits to towns that own or operate small, municipal separate storm sewer systems known as “MS4s” i.e. our storm drains – practically every community.


### IV. Tier A Municipal Stormwater General Permit (GP)

Hillsdale and other municipalities were issued a Tier A Municipal Stormwater General Permit in 2004 and renewed it in 2009. The current permits which were due for renewal in 2014 have been extended while NJDEP prepares updated Stormwater Management permit language. The Borough pays an annual fee to the DEP for this permit although has undertaken no changes to its storm drains.

Your permit authorizes new/existing stormwater discharges to surface water or groundwater from municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s) of Tier A municipalities.

The permit also authorizes new and existing non-stormwater discharges to streams such as:

- Uncontaminated ground water (sump pumps & footing drains for example).
- Irrigation water.
- Residential car washing and swimming pool discharges.
- Street wash water.
- Flows from fire fighting activities including washing of fire fighting vehicles.



Examples of municipal discharges not authorized by the permit are:

- “Industrial activity” such as landfills and recycling facilities.
- Certain facilities handling domestic sewage.

Some of the Borough’s responsibilities under their permit are to develop and enforce a “Stormwater Program” to reduce the discharge of pollutants to our storm sewer system to protect water quality. Under our “Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan” we have laid out a methodology to meet permit requirements through:

- Local public education (newsletters, handouts at public events like Oktoberfest).
- Inlet labeling (completed by the DPW).
- Mapping of storm drains and their outfalls (Completed in 2009).
- Illicit connection elimination program (sanitary sewer connections to street storm drains or private gray water discharges to storm drains).
- Managing effective street sweeping.
- De-icing material storage.
- DPW employee training.




## V. Municipal Ordinance Adoptions

The Borough has already adopted regulatory ordinances to control improper disposal of various wastes such as:

- Pet waste, litter, wildlife feeding.

- Spilling, dumping, or disposal of materials other than stormwater into storm sewers.
- Refuse container/dumpster.
- Illicit connection elimination via:
  - ✓ Mapped outfalls
  - ✓ Ordinances prohibiting illicit connections to storm sewers
  - ✓ Physical inspection of outfalls to detect and eliminate any illicit connections by identifying dry weather flows
  - ✓ Solids and floatables control at inlets by retrofitting inlets with new curb pieces to restrict solids from entering
  - ✓ Street sweeping in commercial areas
  - ✓ Catch basin cleaning program
  - ✓ Outfall pipe scouring inspection/remediation program
- DPW maintenance yard operation controls:
  - ✓ Proper de-icing chemical storage
  - ✓ Equipment and vehicle wash water recovery
  - ✓ Good housekeeping practice for materials and machinery
  - ✓ Training of employees



The Borough Engineer's office prepares the Borough's annual report and certification each year for submission to NJDEP. The Borough reports on its progress and activities for the year so that the State can assess how we are meeting our Stormwater Management goals.

Since I last reached out to you, I have new information to share. There are now almost 70 municipalities that have adopted the ordinance to ban the sale of puppy mill animals across our state (see attached list). Currently, nine towns have adopted the ordinance in Bergen County and at least three more have had their first reading. Bergen County encourages each municipality to adopt this ordinance.

Here is a link directing you to a report on a recent investigation of New Jersey pet stores by the Humane Society of the United States that graphically illustrates the connection between pet stores and puppy mills. The report's contents are disturbing and that is exactly why we are asking you to pass a law to stop puppy stores that buy animals from horrible, cruelty-filled commercial breeders from opening in you town.

Dear Ms Kohan,

I wanted to share with the Mayor and Council some new developments recently surrounding the ordinances Banning the sale of commercially bred puppies and cats in Bergen County.

Dear Mayor and members of Township Council:

We recently e-mailed you information regarding the growing trend of New Jersey municipalities banning the retail sale of puppies and kittens bred in mass commercial breeding facilities (otherwise known as puppy mills). We asked you to consider adopting an ordinance of your own. Today, we are following up with answers to some frequently asked questions:

**The Ordinance is Enforceable as Written:**

The model ordinance attached to this email was drafted with the assistance of the Humane Society of the United States. It has been adopted all over the country. The strongest ordinances prohibit the retail sale of puppies and kittens unless sourced from a shelter or rescue. Insertion of the term "Hobby Breeder" will render your ordinance unenforceable as well as illegal under current state law. The language in the model complies fully with existing state law and does not impose any unlawful restraint on trade.

**Note: If you decide to pass an ordinance, please share a copy with us prior to its introduction.**

**Proposed Revision of State Law:**

You may have heard that state legislation is pending on this issue. Senate bill S63, a revision of the Pet Purchase Protection Act, is in progress but there are no guarantees that it will become law. **This bill is not intended to be a substitute for local ordinances.** In fact, it provides for local municipalities to impose additional restrictions on pet shops.

**Why Adopt a Local Ordinance?**

- To help end the cruelty of factory breeding, which allows puppies and kittens to live in deplorable conditions (documented by USDA inspection reports);
- To encourage the adoption of deserving dogs and cats from taxpayer-supported shelters and lower the number of animals unnecessarily euthanized in New Jersey (which currently stands at 21,000 per year);
- To preserve a consumer's right to purchase a pet from a responsible breeder in a face-to-face sale where they meet the breeder and the puppy's parents;
- To protect citizens from the heartache and financial hardship that can result from purchasing a sick, factory-bred puppy.

**Bergen County Freeholders Support the Ban:**

The Freeholders of Bergen County have stated emphatically that they support a county-wide ban on the sale of puppies and kittens bred in mills. EACH MUNICIPALITY MUST PASS THEIR OWN ORDINANCE IN ORDER TO BE PROTECTED! It is our hope that you will follow your county's recommendation and proceed to adopt an ordinance. Attached, for your convenience, is a model of an ordinance that has already been adopted.

### **Immunize Your Community with an Ordinance:**

Please contact us if you have any questions. We look forward to attending a council meeting to speak directly on this issue and provide factual answers. The public is overwhelmingly in support of humane treatment of companion animals and the adoption of these ordinances.

Dear Mayor and Council Members:

The movement to stop the sale of puppy mill dogs and cats in New Jersey is gaining steam! Will your town be the next to take a stand against the inhumanity of commercial breeding facilities?

Although 2.5 million healthy, adoptable, dogs are euthanized in this country every year, including 20,000 in New Jersey, commercial breeders continue to mass produce puppies and kittens in appalling conditions. The parent animals, housed in unsanitary conditions, enjoy no human contact, receive no veterinary care, are never groomed. Many live entire lives in wire cages the size of a dishwasher. When they can no longer reproduce, they are discarded. Kittens and puppies from these factories are shipped to pet stores around the country and sold to unsuspecting consumers at exorbitant prices.

The Humane Society, ASPCA, NJSPCA, Best Friends Animal Society and Friends of Animals United are tireless advocates for legislation to stop the retail sale of puppies and kittens from these real-life houses of horror. These Ordinances protect citizens because commercially bred animals often develop physical and behavioral problems resulting in expensive veterinary care and heartbreak for unsuspecting buyers. Many of these poor creatures eventually wind up in shelters. Municipalities like yours support these shelters with local tax dollars. Why not support them with legislation that encourages adoption and curtails the for-profit importation of unhealthy animals? Consumers will retain the right to choose from a wide selection of deserving animals available from shelters, rescue organizations and breeders who operate responsibly.

New Jersey Residents Against Puppy Mills hopes to inspire municipalities throughout the state to join this movement. As more and more municipalities take action, those that do not are at greater risk of a pet store opening in their community. Once open, such stores can be difficult to regulate and even more difficult to shut down

We recently sent you an email with a story about a North Jersey puppy store owner. This spring, facing hundreds of counts of animal cruelty, he lost his business licenses in East Brunswick and Paramus. He has stated publicly that he hopes to open more stores in New Jersey. Could a puppy store open in your town? It happened in Cherry Hill last summer. Protesters picketed the store decrying the indisputable link between pet shops and puppy mills. After months of protests, Cherry Hill adopted a puppy mill ban. Fortunately, this puppy store has transitioned into a rescue/adoption center and placed over 800 rescued puppies with loving families. When a community denounces inhumanity, lives are saved.

The way to immunize your community against such a scenario is to proactively pass an ordinance prohibiting stores from selling puppy mill dogs and cats. Nationally, over 150 such laws have been passed including 46 in New Jersey. Each of these cities and towns has expressed by legislative action a public policy that condemns inhumane practices.

If you decide to move forward with an ordinance, please share a copy with us prior to introduction. The model ordinance we have attached to this email was created by Humane Society attorneys with extensive experience. Ordinances that followed this model have stood up to legal challenges in several states. The language in the model complies fully with existing New Jersey law. Deviating from the suggested wording may result in an ordinance that is unenforceable. We strongly recommend that you adopt the ordinance as written.

Dear Mayor and Council Members:

**Even after being criminally charged, the owner of 4 puppy mill stores in north Jersey, an individual who also owns a puppy mill in Missouri, is now looking to open more stores in your area.** Adopting the attached ordinance will enable you to avoid dealing with this kind of inhumanity and the problems that will arise if you are not prepared.

Already 37 townships across New Jersey have adopted these ordinances. Numerous counties have adopted resolutions supporting the passage and enforcement of these ordinances. Attached is a copy of what has been passed, and we have the legal resources to help you with your specific ordinance.

In Cherry Hill after years without having a "puppy mill" pet store in our town, we had one open up last summer. It took months of protesting for about 20 hours a week, along with passage of our ordinance, to get the owner to agree to convert to rescue only model. In truth, we were lucky that he agreed to change because our ordinance was passed after he opened and would not have impacted him. Passing this ordinance insures that this will not happen in your township. Without it you are at risk!

In six short months, the following counties have passed resolutions: Camden County, Mercer County, Monmouth County, Middlesex County, Ocean County; and the following municipalities have passed ordinances: Westville, Glassboro, Bellmawr, Cherry Hill, Voorhees, Brooklawn, Berlin Borough, Berlin Township, Audubon, Barrington, Mt Ephriam, Merchantville, Laurel Springs, Oaklyn, Somerdale, Haddon Heights, Runnemede, Magnolia, Gloucester City, Audubon Park, Waterford, Gloucester Township, Clementon, Pine Hill, Collingswood, Winslow, Haddon Township, Pt. Pleasant Borough, Pt. Pleasant Beach, Manasquan, Brick Twp, Hoboken City, North Brunswick Twp, East Brunswick Township, Randolph Twp., and Oceanport. Many more are in the process of being introduced and passed each week.

"Puppy mills" mass produce puppies and kittens in horrendous conditions typified by cruel neglect of the parent animals. The Humane Society, the ASPCA, NJSPCA, FAUN - NJ and Best Friends Animal Society strongly support ordinances aimed at the elimination of such suffering. Banning puppy mill sales will not negatively impact a consumer's ability to obtain a puppy because Bergen County has excellent shelters as well as rescue organizations and local responsible breeders from which to choose. The ordinance will protect consumers, since commercially bred dogs and cats often develop physical and behavioral problems, resulting in expensive veterinary care and heartbreak.

In recent testimony before the New Jersey Senate, Camden County Freeholder Jeffrey Nash stated, "This is a movement that has gained enormous steam because when you take a hard look at this issue, you have no choice but to support the ban...the window of opportunity to make positive change is here and now...TO MAKE VERY RIGHT A TERRIBLE WRONG."

I hope we can inspire you to join this important movement. As more and more municipalities take action, failing to do so means you are at greater risk of a puppy mill pet store opening in Hillsdale. We believe that most members of your community would support this ordinance. What community would not want to be animal friendly?

I look forward to hearing from you.

**CITY OF HACKENSACK  
ORDINANCE NO. 24-2016**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PART II ENTITLED  
"General Legislation," CHAPTER 52 ENTITLED "ANIMALS",  
BANNING THE SALE OF DOGS AND CATS FROM PET SHOPS**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-2, the governing body of a municipality may make, amend, repeal, and enforce such other ordinances, regulations, rules and by-laws not contrary to the laws of this state or of the United States, as it may deem necessary and proper for the good of government, order and protection of person and property, and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the municipality and its inhabitants, and as may be necessary to carry into effect the powers and duties conferred and imposed by this subtitle, or by any law; and

**WHEREAS**, a significant number of puppies and kittens sold at pet shops come from large-scale, commercial breeding facilities where the health and welfare of the animals are not adequately provided for ("puppy mills" and "kitten mills," respectively). According to The Humane Society of the United States, it is estimated that 10,000 puppy mills produce more than 2,400,000 puppies a year in the United States and that most pet shop dogs and cats come from puppy mills and kitten mills; and

**WHEREAS**, the documented abuses endemic to puppy and kitten mills include overbreeding; inbreeding; minimal to non-existent veterinary care; lack of adequate and nutritious food, water and shelter; lack of socialization; lack of adequate space; and lack of adequate exercise; and

**WHEREAS**, the inhumane conditions in puppy and kitten mill facilities lead to health and behavioral issues in the animals bred in those facilities, which many consumers are unaware of when purchasing animals from pet shops due to both a lack of education on the issue and misleading tactics of pet shops in some cases. These health and behavioral issues, which may not present themselves until some time after the purchase of the animals, can impose exorbitant financial and emotional costs on consumers; and

**WHEREAS**, current Federal and State regulations do not adequately address the sale of puppy and kitten mill dogs and cats in pet shops; and

**WHEREAS**, restricting the retail sale of puppies and kittens to only those that are sourced from shelters or rescue organizations is likely to decrease the demand for puppies and kittens bred in puppy and kitten mills, and is likely to increase demand for animals from animal shelters and rescue organizations; and

**WHEREAS**, according to the New Jersey Department of Health 2014 Animal Intake and Disposition Survey, due in large part to pet overpopulation, more than 20,000 dogs and cats are euthanized in New Jersey animal shelters annually. Restricting the retail sale of puppies and kittens to only those that are sourced from animal shelters and rescue organizations will likely

reduce pet overpopulation and thus the burden on such agencies and financial costs on local taxpayers; and

**WHEREAS**, across the country, thousands of independent pet shops as well as large chains operate profitably with a business model focused on the sale of pet services and supplies and not on the sale of dogs and cats. Many of these shops collaborate with local animal shelters and rescue organizations to offer space and support for showcasing adoptable homeless pets on their premises; and

**WHEREAS**, this Ordinance will not affect a consumer's ability to obtain a dog or cat of his or her choice directly from a breed-specific rescue organization or a shelter, or from a hobby breeder where the consumer can see directly the conditions in which the dogs or cats are bred, or can confer directly with the hobby breeder concerning those conditions; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Hackensack believes it is in the best interests of this Municipality to adopt reasonable regulations to reduce costs to the City and its residents, protect the citizens of City who may purchase cats or dogs from a pet shop or other business establishment; help prevent inhumane breeding conditions, promote community awareness of animal welfare, and foster a more humane environment in the City .

**WHEREAS**, the City of Hackensack ("City") wishes to amend Part II of The City of Hackensack Municipal Code entitled "General Legislation," Chapter 52 entitled "Animals," Section 17, entitled "Definitions" to update various provisions regarding the definition of "Pet Shop"; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Hackensack ("City") wishes to amend Part II of The City of Hackensack Municipal Code entitled "General Legislation," Chapter 52 entitled "Animals," Section 17, entitled "Definitions" to update various provision

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HACKENSACK**, as follows:

**Section 1.** Part II of The City of Hackensack Municipal Code entitled "General Legislation," Chapter 52 entitled "ANIMALS," Section 17A, entitled "DEFINITIONS" is amended, such that it reads:

**Animal care facility** means an animal control center or animal shelter, maintained by or under contract with any state, county, or municipality, whose mission and practice is, in whole, or significant part, the rescue and placement of animals in permanent homes or rescue organizations.

**Animal rescue organization** means any not-for-profit organization which has tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code, whose mission and practice is, in whole or in significant part, the rescue and placement of animals in permanent homes.

**Cat** means a member of the species of domestic cat, *Felis catus*.

**Dog** means a member of the species of domestic dog, *Canis familiaris*.

**Kennel, Pet Shop or Pound** means any business, shop, establishment, property or place which harbors, keeps or maintains five or more dogs, cats, psittacine birds or similar animals that can be kept as pets or offers to sell any of the aforesaid animals to the general public at retail. Such definition shall not include an animal care facility or animal rescue organization, as defined.

**Offer for sale** means to sell, offer for sale or adoption, advertise for the sale of, barter, auction, give away or otherwise dispose of a dog or cat.

**Section 2.** Part II of The City of Hackensack Municipal Code entitled "General Legislation," Chapter 52 entitled "ANIMALS," Section 21, entitled "REGULATIONS AND RESTRICTIONS" is amended, such that reads:

- (1) A pet shop may offer for sale only those dogs and cats that the pet shop has obtained from or displays in cooperation with:
  - (a) An animal care facility; or
  - (b) An animal rescue organization.
- (2) A pet shop shall not offer for sale a dog or cat that is younger than eight weeks old.
- (3) No dog kept in a kennel, pet shop, dog shelter or pound shall be permitted off such premises except on leash or in a crate or under other safe control.

**Section 3:**


