

## Frequently Asked Questions Transition to Twice Per Week Garbage/Pickup Date Changes

The Borough of Hillsdale will transition to twice per week garbage pickup effective **June 1, 2021**. A flyer has been mailed to all residences and businesses identifying pickup and zone changes (dates of collection). Here is a list of frequently asked questions for your convenience.

**Q: Will my garbage be picked up more than once per week?**

**A: YES, effective June 1, 2021 all household garbage will be picked up twice per week.**

**Q: Am I required to put my garbage out on the second collection day?**

**A: NO, however, the five-item rule still remains in effect per collection day.**

**Q: Will my garbage day change from when it is currently?**

**A: MAYBE, depending on the Zone you are located in will determine which days your garbage is collected. [Click here](#) for Zone listing.**

**Q: Will my recycling still be picked up?**

**A: YES, recycling will be collected on THURSDAY instead of Friday, effective June 1, 2021.**

**Q: Will recycling collection still alternate weeks between cardboard/paper and cans/bottles?**

**A: YES, collection will still alternate on the same schedule moving forward with one week being cardboard/paper and the other cans/bottles.**

## Frequently Asked Questions

### Transition to Twice Per Week Garbage/Pickup Date Changes

**Q: When will my yard debris be collected?**

**A: Vegetative waste/yard debris will be collected on MONDAY and TUESDAY based on the Zone you are located in. See attached Zone listing.**

**Q: What is the last day vegetative waste/yard debris will be collected in the Fall?**

**A: The last day of vegetative waste/yard debris is October 25 and October 26, 2021 depending on the Zone.**

**Q: When will metal be collected?**

**A: White metal will be collected on FRIDAY. White metal/other metal items must be reported to the DPW on Wednesday by calling 201-358-5053.**
