7. State of

Mayor Sapanara said he wished to offer optimism to everyone at this meeting, optimism and hope. As you read the papers every day there is nothing but bad news. The pages are talking about the economy, wars, difficulties with finances and day after day you come away with the feeling that things just aren't going right. One of the things he wanted to say right now is that Hillsdale is in a good state; good government, which we tried to bring to Hillsdale, and that depends on good citizens and you are the good citizens out there making all of this work. He wanted to give some idea of where the money is going: municipal taxes. If you have a \$10,000 tax bill about 20% of that goes to the municipality. Some of it goes to the county, a lot of it goes to the schools, but about 20% goes back to the municipality. If you have a \$10,000 tax bill, \$2,000 which divided up comes to about \$175.00 a month. What do you get for that \$175.00? You get people standing behind me who spend an inordinate amount of time making decisions so that life will be better and easier for you. Councilmember Arnowitz has doing this for over 20 years. Twenty years is a long time and a lot of grief and a lot of difficulties and problems solved. That is certainly some service. Everyone up there does a lot for the community and they are involved. They are involved on a daily basis. You get me as Mayor, you get the Police Department. You get a Police Department that will come to your house in five minutes if you call them. They will save your life, administer CPR, solve a problem you may be having with your spouse, intervene, and they are there seven days a week 24 hours a day. They are the kind of people you are getting for your money,

You get the Fire Department. Fire Department consists of volunteers and they will come to your house, save your property and save your life if your house is on fire. You can't ask for much more than that. The Police and Fire Department, in certain circumstances, saved people's lives in Hillsdale and that is the kind of thing we can't put a price tag on. That is all included in your \$175.00 a month.

Ambulance Corps. If you are sick or having heart problems, they will come to your house and in that Ambulance Corps we have Mr. Abolafia. Mr. Murphy has been a member for about 40 years and puts in time every Friday night. Captain Lori Famoso puts in thousands of hours of every year as a volunteer. Jeff Alboum works at the Fire Department, Ambulance Corps as well as working for the DPW. That also is part of your \$175.00. He said this is a real bargain.

Department of Public Works, Waste Management. They will pick up your garbage a couple of times a week and

whatever you care to put on the curb on Thursdays and Fridays. Leaves, snow removal are included. You get to participate in Recreation Programs, Library Programs; the Library is free. Go to the Library and get any book you want, they will get it for you and won't cost you a dime. That is all part of your \$175.00 which you pay back to the municipality every single month.

I sit there and think about this, how can you complain about this and that when all of this is going on. He wants people to bring things to our attention and he wants people to complain about things they feel are unjust or not right. We live in a very special place. We live in a place where all these things are provided to you for a lot less money than they cost elsewhere. Just looking through this room, there are a couple of folks who come here every meeting and go back and talk to the senior citizens about the content of the meeting and let them know what is going on.

Members of our Board of Health are here, they do a lot of programs for your benefit; for the benefit of kids, for the benefit of senior citizens and a Public Health Nurse, Lois Kohan, has been doing this for a number of years. There is a lot of social assistance hopefully you will never need but it is there in case you or your neighbors need it.

Our court system. You saw our Public Defender and our Judge, that system works so well that we are sharing it with another municipality. Our Board of Health has some programs; child health conference that 11 other towns use ours because it is something they don't have and they use ours because it is a very good system.

We have people from the Press who come to every meeting and report what they see. Some of it is good and some is bad but he is glad for the opportunity to try to meet the needs of the Borough of Hillsdale.

He wants everyone to know that good government depends on good citizens. There are so many people out there who volunteer to make this work; the Recreation Programs Kate Leonard and Patty Hughes; the people who volunteer for the sports programs. All that works because people like you make it work. If it wasn't for citizens like you, it wouldn't work at all. Each and every year he realizes things can be tough but they could be a lot worse, but they are better because of folks like you and folks sitting behind me. He said he is really proud to be the Mayor here in Hillsdale. The job is made a lot easier by people who volunteer, by people who take on the real responsibility. It is hard to say thank you enough to the people who really make things work. That is the message he would like to leave to everyone here in 2010.

He said he found a rock that looks just like New

Jersey, shaped like the state, with Hillsdale there. It is solid and that is the way he feels about Hillsdale, it is in good hands with this Council, it is in good hands with our appointments, our Boards, Commissions and members of the various committees and it will continue to be like that because of the people willing to serve. He thanked all for allowing him to be the Mayor and thanked everyone for all they do to make things work.

The Founding Fathers had it right, they wrote the Constitution, the Declaration of Independence. He reminded everyone of the First Amendment in the Bill of Rights of the United States Constitution which says: "Congress shall make no Law respecting and establishment of religion or prohibiting the free exercise thereof or freedom of speech or of the press or the right of the people peacefully to assemble and to petition the government for a redress of grievances." That is what we do twice a month here in Hillsdale at Council Meetings and we encourage people to come forward and let us know what you think. Hopefully it won't be grievances but if it is, we welcome the opportunity to try to set things right. Those words were written over 200 years ago and they are still in effect today and that in itself is an amazing thing.

24. GENERAL PUBLIC HEARING:

Mayor Sapanara opened the meeting to the public and invited comment from the audience. Seeing no one, the public portion of the meeting was closed.

25. COUNCIL COMMENTS

Mayor Sapanara invited comments from Council members.

Councilmember Hanlon thanked the citizens of Hillsdale for their confidence in voting for her. She had a slight fall in her driveway two weeks ago and thanked everyone for support and assistance.

Councilmember Schiavone thanked Kathy Donovan. She has been doing her job for 22 years and hasn't had the opportunity to get to the Pascack Valley area. Recently she saw a movie where a group of several women moved into the same home together for financial reasons. Some are working, some are not, typical of what is going on today with people losing their jobs. At the end of every day they toast and say we made it through another day. She thought it appropriate to say that this Mayor and Council made it through another year and it was a tough year with a lot of decisions, very heated debates and the best service we could give to the Borough for the least amount of money. She thanked all department heads, Borough employees, volunteers who had to cut their budgets, cooperate with the Council with having to change insurance companies in order to save money and meet our budget, getting the sports associations to donate to the fees for the lights for the fields and things of that nature. She thanked everyone for their cooperation.

As Fire Commissioner this year, she was able to see several efforts of our emergency services, police, fire and ambulance; they are amazing and she has seen the immediate response that they provide and it is amazing. She is very proud that we have that in this town. She thanked everyone for the opportunity to serve another year.

Councilmember Weinstein congratulated the appointees and volunteers. He appreciated the support from his fellow Councilmembers with regard to the position of Council President. It has been a difficult year and he believed 2010 starts off more hopeful. This Council has kept themselves above the fray, the impact is felt here but we are also a very solid community with our activities and finances. We will continue that we don't make life too expensive for the residents here and we look forward to an exciting 2010.

Councilmember Arnowitz wished everyone a Happy New Year. He has a lot of faith in our country and government and we will prevail and

the same is true of this Borough. We have a diverse group up here, we watch everything and we will get through this crisis with the least amount of effect on the residents of our town. The rock is a good analogy and we are the rock.

He congratulated Councilmembers Hanlon and Schiavone. The ease of their re-election is a testament to who they are and what they have done over the years. They are extremely dedicated and hard working Council members.

Councilmember DeJoseph congratulated Councilmembers Hanlon and Schiavone and Council President Weinstein. The year 2009 was difficult for our residents, unemployment 10% nationally and some of our residents are under employed. Difficult decisions were made last year and will be made over the coming years. We have the responsibility to do as much as we can for our residents. Some of our accomplishments were achieved without affecting any service in town. We have been able to reduce costs to the taxpayers. We have secured grants from PSE&G. Hillsdale will be forming a Green Team and many residents have expressed interest in becoming part of the Green Team. He listed the various tasks that will be implemented in the coming year. He thanked the residents of Hillsdale in allowing him to serve them and the Council members and Mayor for their support.

Councilmember Giancarlo congratulated Councilmembers Hanlon and Schiavone on their re-election and Councilmember Weinstein as Council President. Taxes are very much on our minds. Regarding our Founding Fathers, with a country of 15,000,000 during the Revolutionary War, how did they manage to run 15,000,000 people when they were in Washington for a month or two. It is truly remarkable. They went back home, they farmed, worked as millers or smiths, but they managed to do it all in two months. They probably would look at our government as unusual. He believed we suffer from too much government; we have town government, county government, city government, state government, federal government. There are detrimental sides to all of this government. His goal is to recognize our stewardship obligations for the future and we need to act diligently. He thanked the citizens for the opportunity to serve for another year.

Mayor Sapanara said the Council is thinking about your welfare and it is refreshing because they put an awful lot of work into it and he is proud to be a part of that.

We have a new Governor this year and we will see how we can integrate with the state on some issues, notably the Council on Affordable Housing, the county government, few changes at the Freeholder Board. About 12% of the tax dollar goes to the county and that is a good portion of the budget.
